Statement on fluoridation

"Preventive measures are the best tools to keep dental diseases in check. Adding fluoride to water supplies will greatly reduce the incidence of cavities and tooth decay," says Robert Dennison, DMD, Chairperson of DDPA's Dental Policy Committee. "Dental disease can affect anyone and lead to serious oral health problems. DDPA urges any and all non-fluoridated communities to consider fluoridation. And DDPA also supports communities that aren't fluoridated in their efforts to become fluoridated."
